1. Students must have 60 units to enter into the Major: BA in Social Work – there is only one Lower Div Requirement: STAT95, which can be taken to also satisfy GE Area B4 Requirement. GE Area B4 must be completed with a C or better. If you do not get a C or better in STAT95 you will need to take the course again or take another GE Area B4 course. 2. GE Area B3 can be taken with GE Area B1 or with GE Area B2. 3. All courses that are bold and italicized must be completed with a C or better (or a CREDIT for ScWk140) in order to move forward in the program (and/or graduate). 4. *The courses with an asterisk are what we refer to as the CORE Courses which are necessary to make progress in the major. 5. **SJSU Studies Course Suggestions: AREA-R: Anthro160; NuFS139; or NuFS163; AREA-S: Comm174; MAS130, MAS160; WomS101; AREA-V: Anth146, MAS175; MuSc117; MuSc120; AREA-Z: ScWk100W†; ChAd100W; HPfr100W; Psyc100W; Soci100W; SocS100W. Except for AREA-Z (the 100W course), there is no required order in which the SJSU Studies courses are taken in order to successfully complete the BA in Social Work.
